
A screening determination on an incoming report is made by State Central Intake (SCI).

Reasons for non-acceptance may include: No specific allegation/risk of abuse/neglect. Insufficient information to investigate. Referral to another agency. Perpetrator is non-caretaker/out-of-home. Referral to law enforcement. Does not meet sufficiency screen criteria.


An Unknown report is a report that did not contain a zip code at the time the report was accepted. Once accepted, the PS report is assigned to the appropriate county office for investigation.

Total Reports










Total Allegations




Unsubstantiated Allegations












CPS Victims by Age (Quarterly)







The national standard states that no more than 0.57% of all children who were in foster care during the reporting period will be subjects of substantiated maltreatment by a foster parent or facility staff.

Quarterly data has proven to be unreliable to track this standard, due primarily to the length of time between receipt of a report and substantiation/unsubstantiation of the allegations. The result is that a number of maltreatment incidents may not be included on quarterly reports, resulting in underreporting of the true incidence of maltreatment in foster care.



The national standard states that at least 32% of all children who exit care to a finalized adoption should exit care in less than 24 months from the time of their latest removal from home. New Mexico has exceeded national standard in the seven of the last eight quarters.

Adoption data is collected immediately after the end of each quarter. The lag between finalization hearings and receipt of the legal documents can result in fewer reported adoptions. Adoptions that are not included in the quarterly data are captured in the annual datum point.








Children's Placements Prior To An Adoption Agreement








Legal Statistics







Age of Children in Foster Care as of December 31, 2004


