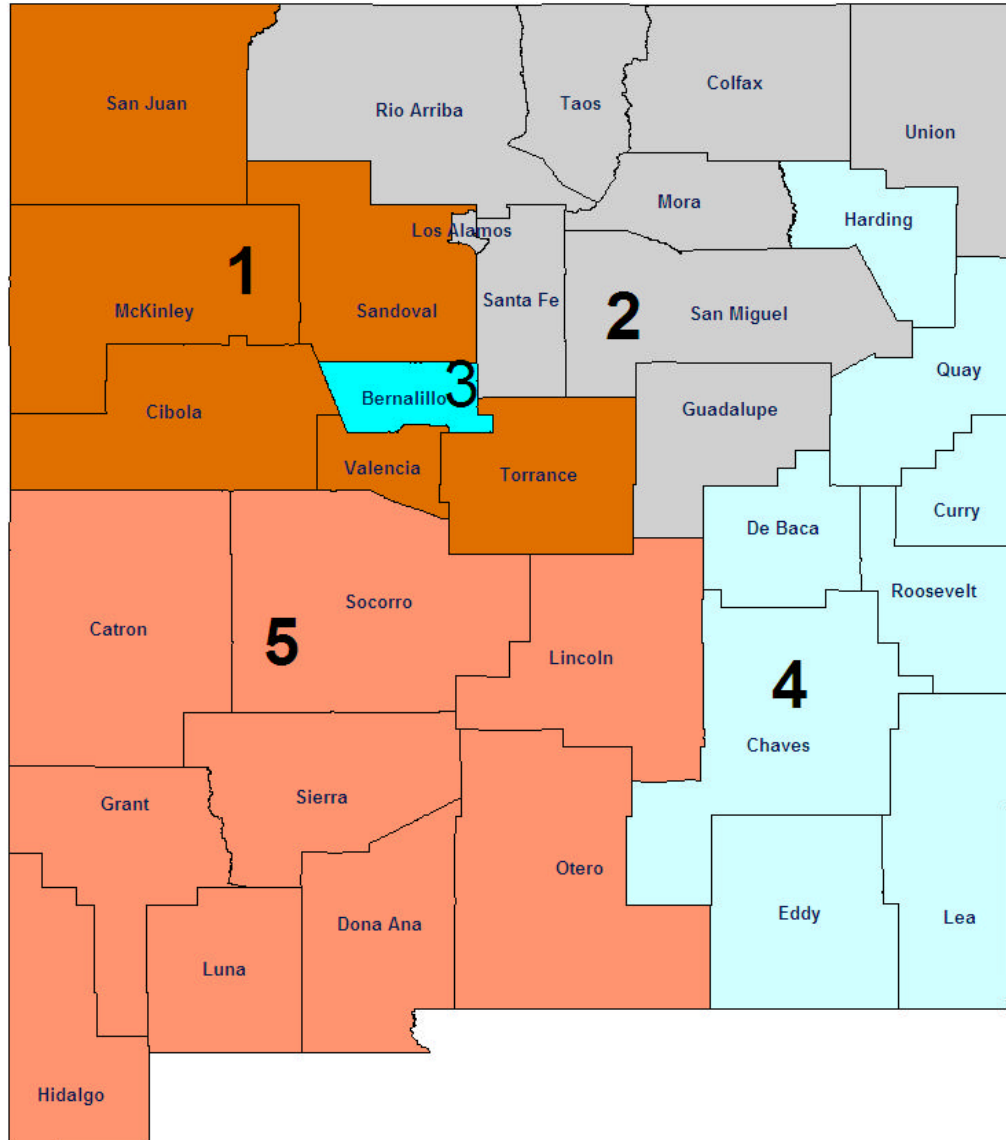

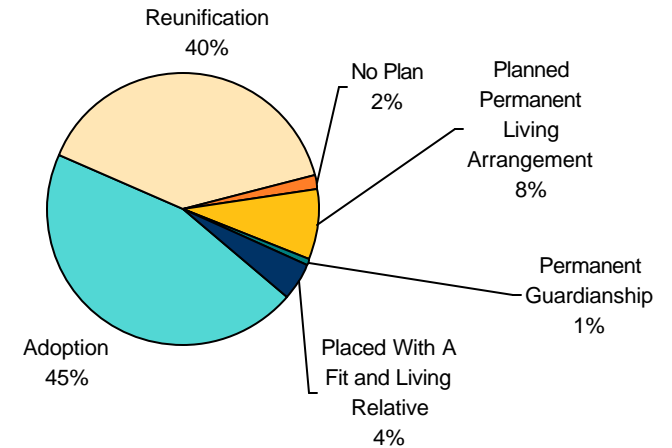

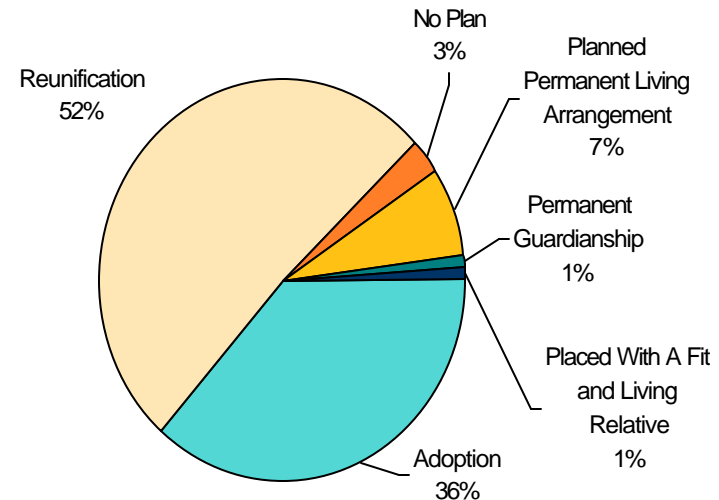

— Institutional Care

Institutional Care may include Crisis Shelter, Emergency Shelter and Group Home placements.

— Title IV-E Guardianships:

These children were part of the federally sponsored IV-E demonstration project. On-going Support provided by State General Fund resources.

— Title IV-E Tribal:

For Native American children being served by their tribes. The tribes have joint power of agreements with the State. They receive foster care payment.

— Residential Treatment Care

Residential Treatment Care may include RTC JHACO Accredited and Non-Accredited placements.

— Treatment Foster Care

Treatment Foster Care serves those children in need of a high level of care to address behavioral health needs.

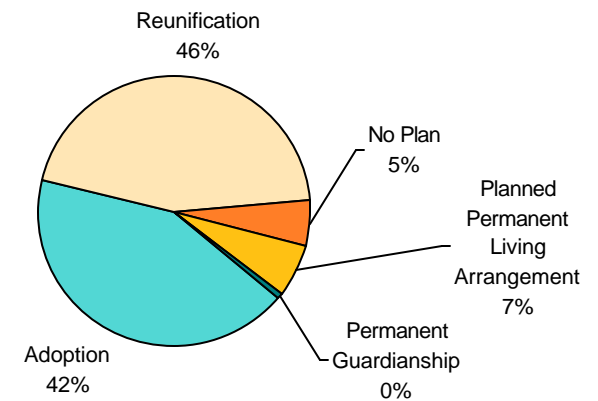

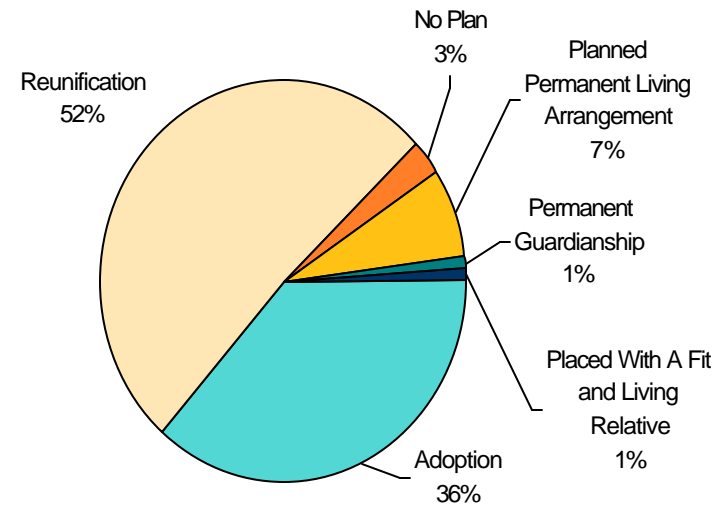

For Native American children being served by their tribes. The tribes have joint power of agreements with the State. They receive foster care payment.
- Residential Treatment Care
Residential Treatment Care may include RTC JHACO Accredited and Non-Accredited placements.
- Treatment Foster Care
Treatment Foster Care serves those children in need of a high level of care to address behavioral health needs.
