
### Foster Care Entries, Exits, and Short Stays




### Children in Care by Placement Type (last day of month)






### Placement Moves and Initial Relative Placements







### Turnover & Vacancy Rates for Key PS Field Positions<sup>1</sup>












### Permanency in 12 Months of Entry

**Children with a Plan of Adoption:** These data, which come from ROM, are intended to track statewide progress addressing adoption and TPR backlogs. Generally, we hope to see the distribution of children with an adoption goal skew more toward the top of the column. We have seen some steady progress on this issue thanks to numerous efforts around the state.

**Caseworker Visits:** Caseworker visits with children are displayed in ROM in two reports: One showing a point-in-time count of completed visits, and one showing a historical percentage of completed visits for previous months. At this time, there is no ROM report that captures worker-parent visits. These percentages are calculated twice each month using FACTS report sm0809. The report is run one week prior to the end of the month, and again one week after the end of the month. Data presented in this document are based on the latter. **Turnover & Vacancy Rates for Key PS Field Positions:** These data are obtained from PS human resources. For this report, turnover and vacancy are presented for key county-level field positions: Investigations, Permanency Planning, and Placement workers and senior workers. Supervisors are excluded. A broader turnover calculation is reported quarterly to the Legislative Finance Committee. The positions included here drive turnover and vacancy at the county level, and staff retention for these positions is crucial for

**Estimated Caseloads:** These are calculated using data from ROM, FACTS reports, and PS human resources. Investigation caseloads are calculated using all pending reports and those that come in during the month (divided by number of investigators); permanency planning caseloads are based on the number of children in foster care during the month (divided by number of PPWs); and placement caseloads are calculated based on the number of provider families, including ICPC families residing in-state (divided by number of placement workers). **Repeat Maltreatment:** This measure is calculated for us in ROM and is a federal reporting measure that uses a 12-month rolling reporting period. Because the children in the denominator experienced their initial incident of maltreatment (substantiated allegation) at least one year ago, improvement on this measure can take some time to show in the data.
